PREMIER 2016 OPPORTUNITIES

Opening Address and Plenary Session on Nutrition Research Enterprises \$15,000

New for 2016, an opening plenary session will feature a presidential address and discussion on a timely topic impacting the nutrition community. As the home of nutrition researchers from academia, government and the private sector, ASN is well positioned to serve as a platform to encourage public dialog. This year, we will address the polarization of the nutrition and biomedical research communities on the topic of industry funded research. The plenary session and moderated panel discussion will explore the issue, determine areas of collaboration, identify other strategies to improve the nutrition research enterprise, gain a mutual understanding of potential biases and conflicts of interest that are inherent to different sources of funding and, through the development of guidelines and best practices, foster a culture of respect of all biomedical research independent of the funding source.

Emerging Leader Poster Competition

\$50,000 (exclusive sponsor) \$30,000 (leading sponsors)

In its second year, this popular program recognizes the highest quality research presented by students and young investigators at ASN's Scientific Sessions. Each year, more than 1,000 new, original research abstracts are submitted by students and postdoctoral fellows and the *Emerging Leaders in Nutrition Science Competition* recognizes the top 15% highest scoring abstracts as finalists. Abstracts are rated by more than 200 nutrition scientists. Onsite, the finalists compete in a poster competition and grand prize winners are determined in more than 15 different categories. The program aims to bring visibility to the good work being done by future leaders in nutrition science. Last year's competition attracted an enthusiastic, packed crowd.

My ASN Community Kiosk

New for 2016, this highly visible kiosk will be centrally located in the San Diego Convention Center. **My ASN Community** will facilitate networking among ASN's attendees and build ASN's communities - an invaluable benefit to Society membership. Attendees will stop by to pick up their badge ribbons that designate their career stage (e.g., student, early career, faculty members) and membership in various ASN interest groups. The **My ASN Community** kiosk will also feature a social media hub so that attendees can post conference updates and promote their ASN involvement.

The Presidential Symposium

\$15,000

Systems Approaches to Nutrition - Where We are and Where are We Going?

Systems approaches are emerging rapidly and revolutionizing our approaches to studying and understanding the complexity of human metabolism, physiology and behaviors, as well as the environment that sustains life and its relationships to the food system. The convergence of "big data", the genomics revolution, and computer and engineering sciences with the nutrition sciences promise to transform dietary approaches for the prevention and management of chronic disease through personalized nutrition, as well as implementation of more effective nutrition interventions and food systems that support global and public health. This session will highlight the current state and future prospects of systems approaches across the spectrum of the nutritional sciences, from both insider and outsider perspectives. This unopposed session consistently attracts a standing-room only audience.
