



Collaborate @ Science Stage

The pursuit of scientific discovery relies on collaboration – working together, thinking across boundaries, considering new approaches. Collaborations can be interdisciplinary. They can be public-private partnerships. They can cross continents. **Collaborate @ Science Stage** sessions aim to support intellectual endeavors by convening nutrition scientists to share new discoveries, demonstrate innovative technologies and/or discuss future directions. Host a Collaborate session and gain valuable insights from the nutrition science community. These sessions can be:

- An interactive dialogue
- A product theater or service demonstration
- A panel discussion
- Conversation with a trailblazer
- Or other creative formats.

Science Stage will again be located in the **The Hub,** the heart of Nutrition 2019. The Hub is an interactive hall with exhibits, posters, *Poster Theatre*, places to meet up, *ASN Live!* and Science Stage. It is also the site of our opening night reception on Saturday, June 8 and the place for attendees to grab a complimentary lunch on Sunday and Monday.

The following guidelines apply to Collaborate Sessions. All organizers must comply with these standards as well as all other requirements applicable to exhibitors at Nutrition 2019.

Presentation Guidelines

All session presentations must:

- be objective, appropriate, and professional in nature.
- be live programs only; no satellite or simultaneous broadcasts or otherwise non-live programming will be permitted

Collaborate sessions are not permitted to provide CME/CE credit. Organizers must submit speakers and topics to ASN for approval prior to publicizing the program. Collaborate sessions shall not include information, papers, or abstracts scheduled for presentation during Nutrition 2019 that are under embargo at the time of the presentation.

Collaborate sessions and all activities associated with Science Stage must comply with all applicable laws and guidance, including FDA laws, regulations, and guidelines regarding industry-supported scientific and educational activities, the Council of Medical Specialty Societies (CMSS) Code for Interactions with

Companies, the PhRMA Code on Interactions with Healthcare Professionals, and the Physician Payments Sunshine Act.

Each Collaborate session organizer is solely responsible for the content of its presentation, including securing speakers and obtaining all appropriate copyright permissions and licenses for slides and other materials that will be presented or distributed.

Before April 1, 2019, only Nutrition 2019 exhibitors who have secured a booth are eligible to apply for a presentation slot on Science Stage, subject to availability and adherence to all published guidelines. After this date, presentation slots will be available on a first come, first serve basis.
